

May 29 Birthdays on this date: 1736, Patrick Henry; 1903, Bob Hope; 1914, Nepalese climber Tensing Norgay; 1917, John F. Kennedy; 1938, Fay Vincent, Major League Baseball Commissioner from 1989-1992; 1939, Al Unser; 1958, actress Annette Bening; and 1984, Carmelo Anthony.

Major Events on this date: South Carolina is incorporated as a royal colony, 1721; Patrick Henry in his speech against the Stamp Act says, "If this be treason, make the most of it.", 1765; Rhode Island becomes the last of the original 13 colonies to ratify the U.S. Constitution, 1790; The official flag of the President of the United States is adopted, 1916; U.S. Supreme Court rules that organized baseball is a sport and not a business and, thus, is not subject to antitrust laws, 1922; Bing Crosby records "White Christmas," Meat and cheese are rationed in the U.S., 1943; Mount Everest was conquered as Edmund Hillary of New Zealand and Tensing Norgay become the first climbers to reach the summit, 1953; Janet Guthrie becomes the first woman to drive in the Indianapolis 500, 1977; Dow Jones Index hits a record 2,870, 1990; Space Shuttle Discovery completes first docking with the International Space Station, 1999; and ABC-TV cancels "Roseanne" after Roseanne Barr posts a racial tweet, 2018.

1. Copy the above link to your clipboard, i.e., highlight the link; right-click the highlighted text, and choose "Copy"
2. Go to your desktop, right-click your mouse and choose "New" and "Shortcut." Paste the link to the box; i.e., right-click your mouse and choose "Paste," Choose "Next."
3. Name the shortcut something like "Monaco South Friday Zoom Meeting" and Choose "Finish."
4. Double-click on the shortcut when you want to join the Friday morning meeting.

Note: For security, the log-in Meeting ID and Password are only located on the GUMS distribution email. If you need help doing this, please call me.

Colorado-Wyoming District: Governor **Tony Carpenter** announced that the six finalists for the District Oratorical contest will be on the district Facebook page via Zoom at 10:00 am Saturday, May 30. Winner of this contest will receive a \$2,000 scholarship and opportunity to participate in the International contest in July.

Sullivan Scholarship: **Joe Marci** announced that the 9 Sullivan Scholarship winners from Thomas Jefferson High School have been invited to the June 26th Zoom meeting.

Hamilton Middle School Accelerated Reader Awards: **Karl Geil** reported that for quite a few years, the Club has sponsored the Accelerated Reader Awards at Hamilton Middle School, where students read age-appropriate novels and take a test on what they have read on a computer. Based on

the test results, points are awarded to the student. Usually, students who accumulate at least 500 points (the equivalent of reading about 3,000,000 words) receive a \$50 award. This year, with schools moving to online learning, the students lost the ability to access both the novels and the tests. So, this year we awarded \$100 to the 5 students who achieved at least 500 points before the world turned upside-down. One of those, a 6th grader, actually achieved more than 1,000 points. We also awarded \$50 each to the 7 students who were on-track to reaching 500 points before the school moved to remote learning. Amber Shearer, one of Hamilton's Assistant Principals, will be distributing the cash awards to the students.

FOO Member Thomas Graumann: **John Oss** sent an email telling us that **Tom Graumann** recently passed away. Because of the social distancing, there are no services scheduled at this time. Tom had a long history and he testified that he was saved twice in his life. Once from the Nazis


