Remembrance of Bob Sullivan: Dick Nickoloff provided a few words about Bob Sullivan. Dick said he had interviewed Bob Sullivan many years ago and learned about his life story. He was a very interesting man and had a great story. Dick also says how proud he is of Thomas Jefferson High School, having put five kids through the school and is aware of the good the school does for the community. What great examples these young people are, the Sullivan Scholarship recipients, who join us today!

Constitutional Scholars Competition: Les Volpe, who just returned from the Washington D.C. area where he served as a national judge for the Constitution Scholars Contest reported, "I witnessed 1,500 students give their presentation at this competition. Listening to 17-year-old students talk about the constitution was very enlightening. They discussed present day cases that are pertinent to today's topics."

Fifty-two different teams from across the country competed. Competing on both Saturday and Sunday, April 26 and 27, and the top ten scoring teams from the first two days competed on Monday, April 30th in the hearing rooms of both Congressional Senate and House buildings. the Denver team from East High School, performed quite well.

On Sunday evening, the organization held the Awards Ceremony in which the winning teams were announced. East High Team placed sixth in the nation for this year. As a part of the ceremony, a guest speaker congratulated the students for their performances, and described how instrumental this program had been in her life. She was a student who participated in 2011-12, and had gone on to obtain her college degree and was accepted by four prestigious law schools for admission. The interesting thing about this young lady, is that she, Cara Mund from North Dakota, was selected as 2018 Miss America.

This is quite a program and has been maintained since 1987—the bicentennial of the year of the Constitutional Convention in Philadelphia in 1787. Les said, "I am pleased to serve as a judge for this program and have been so involved for many years."

National History Day: Karl Geil reminded us and anyone else, that he will act as a judge for National History Day tomorrow on the Auraria Campus along with Joe Marci. This year's theme is "Conflict & Compromise in History."
