Once you have signed up, you are responsible for ensuring that the shift is staffed, either by yourself or by someone else. If you are unable to work the shift, you must find someone else to cover. Those who work 15-hours or more can buy anything on the lot at cost. Shifts are normally 3-hours, but you can work longer if your able.
