All Yogi's Yanks did that year was win the World Series ... and Garver went 20-12 and threw 24 complete games for a St. Louis Browns team that went 52-102. Quite an accomplishment, actually. And Garver batted .305 that season.

That 1951 season was certainly the high point of Garver's career in which he went 129-157 with a 3.73 ERA. In his career he struck out 881 batters and walked 881 batters.

Are you aware that you can help the club by




