Christmas Tree Lot Instruction

Joe Marci had a wide grin on his face all morning long. We found out why when he announced that the Christmas Tree Lot project had already started, and this will be his last

year running it. This will be the fortieth year of the Optimist Tree Lot but not for Joe's involvement. He ran it for many years with the Southeast Denver Jaycees prior to bringing the lot to Monaco South Optimist Club. **Tom Kramis** will be heading up the project starting next year. However, most of the sub-chairman will be staying on. Guys like **Ron Cisco, Gary Miller, Steve Kady, Mike Miller, Greg Young,** and others will be there to help make the transition seamless.

Joe has ordered 1,200 trees from Oregon and Michigan. The trees will be arriving the weekend before Thanksgiving and the lot will be getting set up the week of Thanksgiving. We should be ready to hit the ground running when the lot officially opens the day after Thanksgiving otherwise known as Black Friday.

Joe says that job training will be conducted at a membership meeting just before the lot opens but that most procedures will remain as in past years. This training will be essential for members that have not worked the lot previously but is always a helpful reminder for those who have worked before.

Joe did say that we cannot run the lot with eight cashiers. People will have to sell trees, garland, wreathes, boughs, bags, stands not to mention tote trees, tie them on top of cars and restocking racks. Of course, the usual perks will be available as well. Any members working five FULL shifts will get a tree at cost. Any member working more than 100 hours will get an extra bonus, although, Joe says the bonus has yet to be determined. Steve Kady registered the first official complaint. He said the TV in the trailer, in his words, "sucks." **Jack Kleinhessel** resolved that in short order by saying he would purchase any TV of **Steve Kady's** choosing for the trailer which presents the first problem to be solved. How do we get an 80" flat screen into the trailer? We will also need 14 Day Managers. Two Day Managers will be assigned to each of the 7-days of the week. The Day Managers will monitor their assigned days to be sure all the shifts are adequately shafted and make calls to recruit help where needed.

As in the past, we will be seeking help from high school clubs for manpower on the weekends in exchange for a cash donations to their organizations. As most of you already know, this project raises the vast majority of the cash needed to fund over seventy projects conducted by our club during the year. In large part, it is the reason the Monaco South can continue to lead the Colorado/Wyoming District and be one of the leading clubs in the Optimist International.
