


With that our new OCMS President Dan Rodriguez took


You can all be proud. I thought it worked on such a high level it was almost 'professional'. Only regret, many members weren't there.

Steve Kade introduced our speaker. Lt Colonel Will Di-

Profio who is the Director of Plans. Operations and Military Support (J3) for the Colorado National Guard. He serves as the principal advisor for National Guard Domestic Operations to The Adjutant General and Director of the Joint Staff.

In this capacity, Lieutenant Colonel DiProfio oversees domestic operations planning, training and both current and future military support operations



along with interagency partnerships and force protection. Will has received his Reserve Army commission through the Reserve Officer's Training Corps from the University of New Hampshire in 1996 and joined the New Hampshire Army National Guard as a Field Artillery Officer where he served as a traditional guardsman from 1996 to 2000. In 2000 he moved to Colorado and joined the Colorado Army National Guard.

Will earned a BS and MS in Mechanical Engineering from the University of New Hampshire graduating in 1998. He worked in the Network Management industry first as a Software Developer and then as a Sales Engineer before he transitioned to the Active Guard and Reserve (AGR) program in 2006 and has been a full time guardsman ever since. He was mobilized in support of Operation Noble Eagle, Hurricane Katrina and was deployed to Afghanistan from 2012 to 2013.

Major Awards and Decorations include Bronze Star, Meritorious Service Medal (3rd Award), Army Commendation Medal (6th Award), Army Achievement Medal Army Reserve Components Achievement Medal(4th Award), Global War on Terrorism Service Medal, Humanitarian Service Ribbon, NATO Medal, Army Service Ribbon, Overseas Service Ribbon, Army Reserve Component Overseas Training Ribbon, Armed Forces Reserve Medal, Combat Action Badge.
