Fiscal Year 2017-2018 Financial Reports

Treasurer **Greg Young** shares the Clubs Financial position—see attached to the *GUMS* distribution email. The reports show that the club achieved a favorable balance compared to the budget for the fiscal year in the amount of \$5337.26. We had revenue that exceeded budget by \$13, 384.35. This excess revenue allowed us to do more service projects. We expended a total of \$\$48,237.66 on service projects, an increase of \$12,627.66 more than budgeted. Additionally, due to reduced Club Operating expenses, we achieved the overall favorable performance.

As a result of this performance, our reserves have increased to \$56,314.12 (total equity in statement of financial position), or \$16,314 more than our desired reserves of \$40,000 (per club policies, Section 17).

This allows us some flexibility in budgeting for the upcoming year, and the Board has approved a budget that will, if totally achieved, expend \$9,091.55 of this reserve excess on youth projects, which is included in the total budget expenditure planned which will be\$42,391.65 in youth projects.
