

Mary Jo Heins & Liz Burke Medicare Update & Dispatch Health

Joe Marci introduced our first speaker, <u>Mary Jo Heins</u>. Mary Jo is an independent licensed Medicare insurance

agent, and she came to give us a 2020 Medicare update.

People are eligible to get on Medicare when they turn 65 or have been on Social Security Disability Income for two years. There are two ways to get coverage— Original and Medicare Advantage. Mary

Jo's main message was to be careful who you get your Medicare information from-it

can be very confusing and some "experts" have products to sell.

There are 5 elements of a Medicare Advantage Plan:

- Premium
- Core Health Coverage Benefits
- Rx Formulary
- Network
- Add-on Benefits, such as dental, hearing, OTC allowance

Mary Jo feels that the add-on benefits, which get the most mention in direct mail and TV ads, are the least important element. Also, Core Health Coverage Benefits tend to be very similar across the board. Networks are the most important decision.

There are 7 Medicare Advantage HMO Networks in Colorado:

- Aetna
- Anthem
- Bright
- Cigna Health Spring
- Humana
- Mutual of Omaha
- United Health

Mary Jo then introduced our second speaker, <u>Liz Burke</u>. Liz is the Community Engagement Manager for <u>Dispatch-</u> Health.

Nametag: **Ron Cisco's** name was drawn by President **Meyer** and Ron had on his proper identification. Despite the fact that he may or may not have some inside information as to the location of the Two of Diamonds, he came up short.

They provide a mobile alternative to the Emergency room or urgent care, and work in partnership with primary care. DispatchHealth's goal is to create an integrated, convenient, high touch care delivery solution that extends the capabilities of a patient's care team and provides definitive, quality care in the home while decreasing costs.

Dr. Mark Prather, a former ER doctor, and Kevin Riddleberger created DispatchHealth in Denver in 2013. They provide acute care - there is an approximate 2 hours average wait time, so they do not replace 911 or the Emergency Room. They treat children and adults, and can prescribe medications and administer the first dose. Currently, their coverage area is Boulder to Castle Rock but they have plans to expand. They are open 365 days a year from 7:00 am to 10:00 pm. DispatchHealth is in network with all major insurance carriers and Medicare advantage plans. They bill insurance for you, so patients have an average out of pocket cost of \$5.44.

Liz explained that the main difference between emergency and urgency is that in an emergency there is immediate threat to life, health, property or environment—in this case call 911. Whereas in urgency or acute care, there is no immediate danger or threat to life, health, property or environment, but if not taken care in a given period of time, then the situation may turn to an emergency care situation.

George Buzick gave a testimonial for Dispatch Health. Dispatch responded to a call George made to 911, due to the relationship they have with Denver West metro. George reported that they were thorough and responsible, and he was pleased.

Editor's testimonial: Our family has used DispatchHealth three times, all on the weekends, and all successfully. They were able to administer IVs, do blood and flu tests, and prescribe medications. While we could have gotten to Urgent Care or the ER faster than Dispatch could arrive at our house, there are often long waits at those locations, and our costs with Dispatch were far less.
