  - Steel "U" Channel
  - Exterior siding T-111- 3/4"
  - Metal roofing, ridge cap, or flashing red
  - Electrical conduit PVC 3/4"
  - Romex, grooved 14/2
  - 4' x 8' Interior paneling 3/8"
  - Roof felt 30 pound
- Wall insulation R-13, 15 inch wide rolls




