# On This Date

... the 258th day of 2017 with 107 to follow. In 1954, the famous scene in which Marilyn Monroe is shown laughing as her skirt is blown up by a blast of air from a subway vent was shot during the filming of "The Seven Year Itch." The scene infuriated her husband, Joe DiMaggio, who felt it was exhibitionist. The couple divorced a short time later.

And today, at 7:55:46 a.m. ET, NASA watched its 20-year-old, \$4 billion-plus spacecraft Cassini's crash



into Saturn and made its "grand finale." Launched from Cape Canaveral in October 1997 in a NASA collaboration with the European Space Agency, with an orig-

inal mission planned to last for four years, from June 2004 to May 2008. The mission was extended for another two years until September 2010, branded the Cassini Equinox Mission. The mission was extended a second and final time with the Cassini Solstice Mission, lasting another seven years until today, on which date Cassini was de-orbited by being allowed to burn up in Saturn's upper atmosphere.
