### In the Room



### Spotlight on a Club Member Andy Towt

The spotlight was on **Andy Towt** this morning as he shared memories and reflections of his life, growth, and experiences. His Dad met his Mom in Pennsylvania, whereupon they moved to Boston where he was born. However, they soon moved to New Jersey, but he is still emotionally attached to Boston and speaking the Boston brogue. He never knew the Kardashian clan. His fascination and comparisons of Public education in different cities has been his lifelong passion. The Nuclear family is at risk and he is concerned with the future of our kids not getting a fair and equal education.

He then reflected on the Kennedy assassination and how teachers openly cried and sent kids home. In those days he still walked home. Another memory came during the Vietnam War. He distinctly remembers the daily radio reports reading casualty lists and instinctively knew "this is not good." He subsequently developed an emotional wall around DC, but admitted he visited the Vietnam Memorial Wall and was truly moved by it. The Martin Luther King and Bobby Kennedy 1968 assassinations have stayed with him as well. A tribute to this time of turmoil is recorded in the ballad Abraham, Martin & John.

Moving along, Andy tried wrestling at the urging of an over-zealous Coach in Central NJ, but never made varsity. He said it was a positive experience and he learned a lot about people and life. As a young man he joined the Boy

Scouts to experience camping to get away from the concrete and asphalt of NJ. His Scoutmaster was an ex Drill Sargent who gave them technical life skills that remain forever. Once again he continued Learning about people & how to motivate others by leading the way by doing what is asked. He noted Eagle Scout Projects have evolved to bigger and more expansive endeavors.

He attended the University of Maine on a Student deferment, as a forestry major from NJ. He quickly discovered It was really cold but toughed it out and

graduated. He was more focused than at any other time in his life. He met his wife while in Maine and has been blessed with a son, daughter and four grandkids. He has spent his career working in the Nuclear industry and waste management. The Towt's moved to Colorado 4-years ago to be closer to the rest of the family. It was at his oldest grandson's Super Citizen Award he became energized by the Optimist Club "really doing something." If by magic, John Oss popped up, gave him a card, and invited him to breakfast. At his first breakfast he signed up after seeing a room full of potential new friends. The rest is history. He is extremely active within the Club. He espoused three reasons for moving to Colorado: No bugs, blue sky, and grandkids with Optimists close to being number one. Andy is a true blessing and we all wish him many more of years of camaraderie and Service to Youth.
