Today's Rrogram - Tom Evans introduced our speaker this morning - incumbent State Representative Betty Neale (Republican). Ms. Neale has an impressive accounting and financing background. She started out in politics by becoming a district captain and knocking doors for Barry Goldwater. Betty was among seven freshmen when she was first elected to the legislature. Since 1976 the Republican side of the aisle has controlled the Colorado Legislature. Betty serves primarily on the Finance and Joint Budget Committees. She mentioned that the Lottery was recently audited and that it appears to have good management and a clean operation. No Lottery-Gate here. Every State agency comes under the scrutiny of the Audit Committee. The Finance Committee is the first committee to look at bills dealing with money, which I would imagine would cover a great many of them. Betty indicated that the Colorado Constitution requires that the State have a balanced budget. She also talked about problems in the criminal sentencing area. Sentences ordered are rarely carried out to their maximum extent, but the mood of the public is starting to change. It is asking its representatives to expand the sentencing period for serious crimes and, to a certain extent, is frustrated by the lenient sentences handed out to murderers, child abusers, and sex offenders. Betty also talked about the position she holds on the Mental Health Advisory Board and the need for more apptopriate facilities in the treatment of the mentally.
