






Each Year, the Cosmopolitan Club of Rapid City honors a nonmember who has made significant contributions to our Community. This year, our Club is honoring a member of Law Enforcement. ..Kevin Thom

Kevin retired as Pennington County Sheriff in January of this year. He began his law enforcement career at the Ward County Sheriff's Department in North Dakota.

He then worked for the South Dakota Division of Criminal Justice where he served as Drug Task Force Supervisor, West River DCI Supervisor, Training Administrator, and, finally, Director of the Department. Upon retirement from the DCI, he and his wife moved to the Black Hills.

The City of Rapid City wisely hired him as Community Resources Director where he was responsible for Human Resources, Information and Technology, Code Enforcement and the Community Development Block Grant. It was during this time, that I first met Kevin. He reached out to Pennington County to see if there could be collaboration between the County and the City in a Human Resources project. It would save money for both governments and give them both a better product co work from. This was impressive Jo me.



Kevin believed in "Community Partnering." Upon his retirement, he said, "I just want to stress how community partnerships are so strong out here. That's why we enjoy the successes that we do. The other nonprofits, the other government partners, I think we are kind of the envy of the state in terms of the ability to get things done, and that speaks well with our office in our community." Kevin believed that there had to be a way to develop a working relationship, a Community Partnichip, with Tribal Law Enforcement. It took a lot of time, understanding of cultures, and recognition of the needs of both entities to find a way forward with this. Tribal, federal, state, and county resources contributed to crafting an agreement which allows both the Tribal Police and the Pennington County Sheriff's Department to assist each other when needed while maintaining jurisdictional control and tribal sovereignty. This is a major accomplishment for the betterment of safety in both of our communities.

Kevin was responsible for over 400 employees with an annual budget of \$38 million dollars in four divisions: Law Enforcement, Jail, Western Dakota Juvenile Services Center, and Addiction Treatment Services at the Care Campus. He was a great administrator who was truly responsible with the taxpayer's dollar.
