

President Chuck Reuwsatt Led the Members in Pledge of Allegiance










Jim Schuh, Led the Members in Prayer.











Kaye Duffield talked about John Duffield's health problems he had last Saturday night. He is doing just fine now. We wish him all the best.




President Chuck Reuwsatt talked about the Federation Meeting on April 26 & 27th. He also told the Members about the amount of money we have raised in the last year.

Rodney Gunn talked to the Members about the upcoming Rush Hockey game on March 29th.





Street Outreach

The Street Team Outreach Program at Journey On seeks to fill a persistent need in Rapid City for communityinitiated responses to public safety needs.

The model of community intervention on which the Street Outreach program is based has experienced considerable success in targeted neighborhoods of Newark, New Jersey and Los Angeles, California. The model is one of engagement — the act of meeting people where they are and building a relationship of trust and mutual respect with the goal of the individual accepting further services to achieve violence reduction, permanent shelter, and self-sufficiency.

Our Street Outreach Services:

We deliver daily outreach for the distribution of basic necessities of food, water, hygiene products, and assistance to community service partners and medical transportation.

Our Service Recipients:

Individuals who are homeless or at risk of becoming homeless, who are struggling with alcohol and substance abuse, experiencing a behavioral health crisis, or engaging in disruptive behavior associated related to homelessness, intoxication or behavioral health episodes.

ABOUT SAFE PASSAGE

Safe Passage provides safety for youth as they travel to and from school through a trusted adult presence designed to be there for the youth and their families. The program helps identify any barriers each family faces to get their children to school, after-school programs, events, and partner programs in a timely and safe manner. Safe Passage allows the development of relationships with youth and their parents, intervenes in and mediates potential conflicts, and connects youth and their support systems to needed resources. When there is an observed need, Safe Passage Navigators can share information with families about community services.

In the 2023-2024 school year, we will focus first on the Knollwood community because of the high rates of violent crime in the neighborhood.

North Middle School is among the schools in the district with high truancy rates. Lack of safety has led to lower participation rates in afterschool programs and extracurricular activities. We also wish to be there with the youth in case of before/after school disputes to mediate and reduce threats.

Safe Passage Navigators will be deployed at the school's key exit and entry points, bus stops, and intersections where youth congregate in and around the school. Navigators are posted on Safe Passage routes to support children traveling to and from school during arrival and dismissal times.

Journey On!

Journey On!, a local non-profit organization focused on homeless street outreach, is directing community response efforts to homeless individuals. In November, the Rapid City Police Department and the City of Rapid City finalized a co-response contract with Journey On! to support the homeless population on non-violent calls for service.

Many of these interactions involve transporting homeless individuals to meetings with service partners, medical appointments, safe beds, or meeting with service organizations to work on ongoing care plans with clients. Other interactions consisted of simply making contact for follow-up or mentorship with individuals.

Journey On! staff members check various areas in the community where houseless individuals are known to congregate. They forge relationships, and through all of these efforts, are making a noticeable difference in our community.

The street outreach work performed by Journey On! consists of working all hours, day and night, and being out in harsh conditions. Their outreach work is engaging and has helped to reduce police and ambulance calls for service. We are proud of what they have accomplished in the short time they have dedicated to participating in the co-response effort in Rapid City.


Dee Preston was the Lucky Mrs. X for the Day. She Won \$5.00


