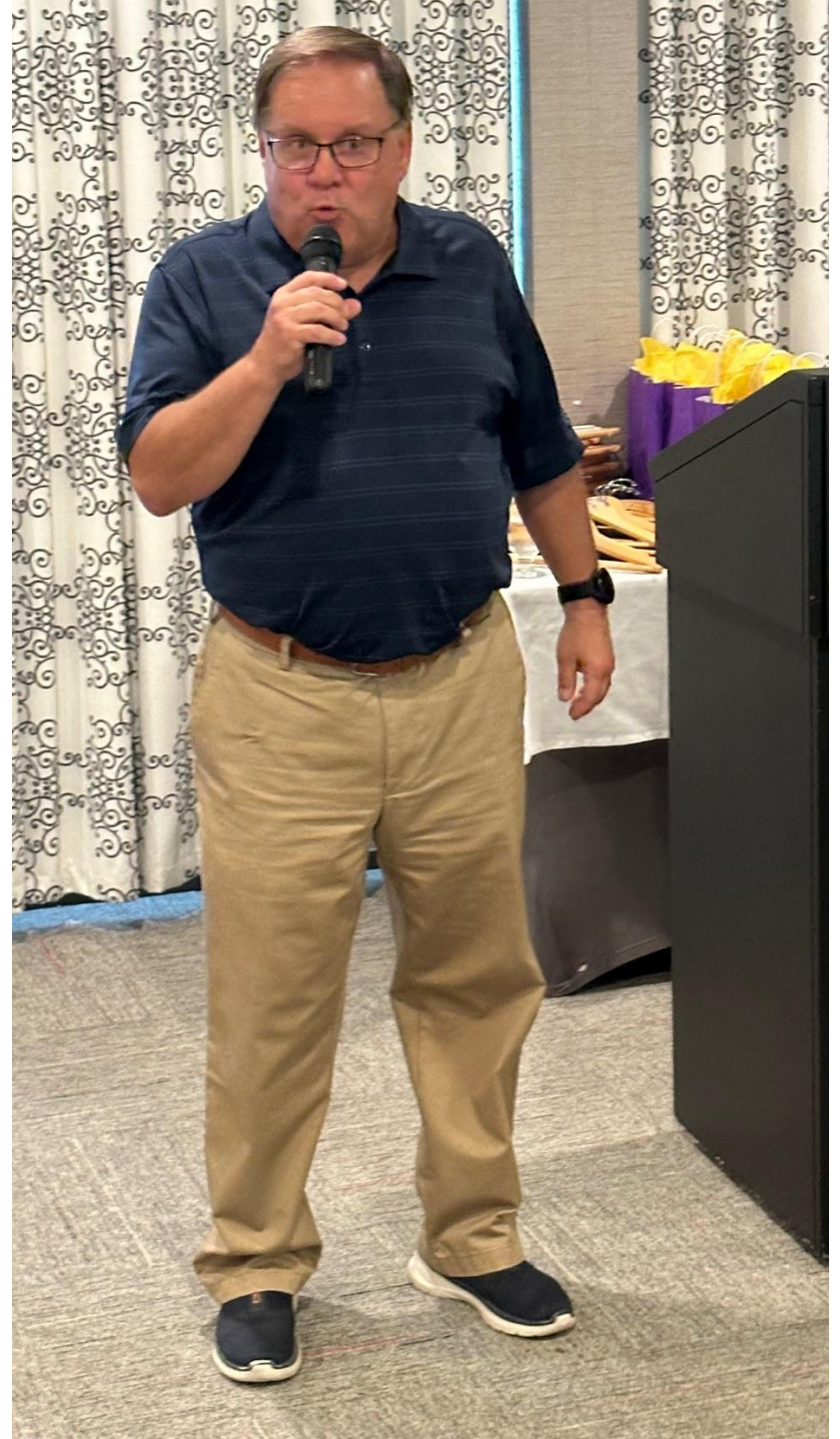

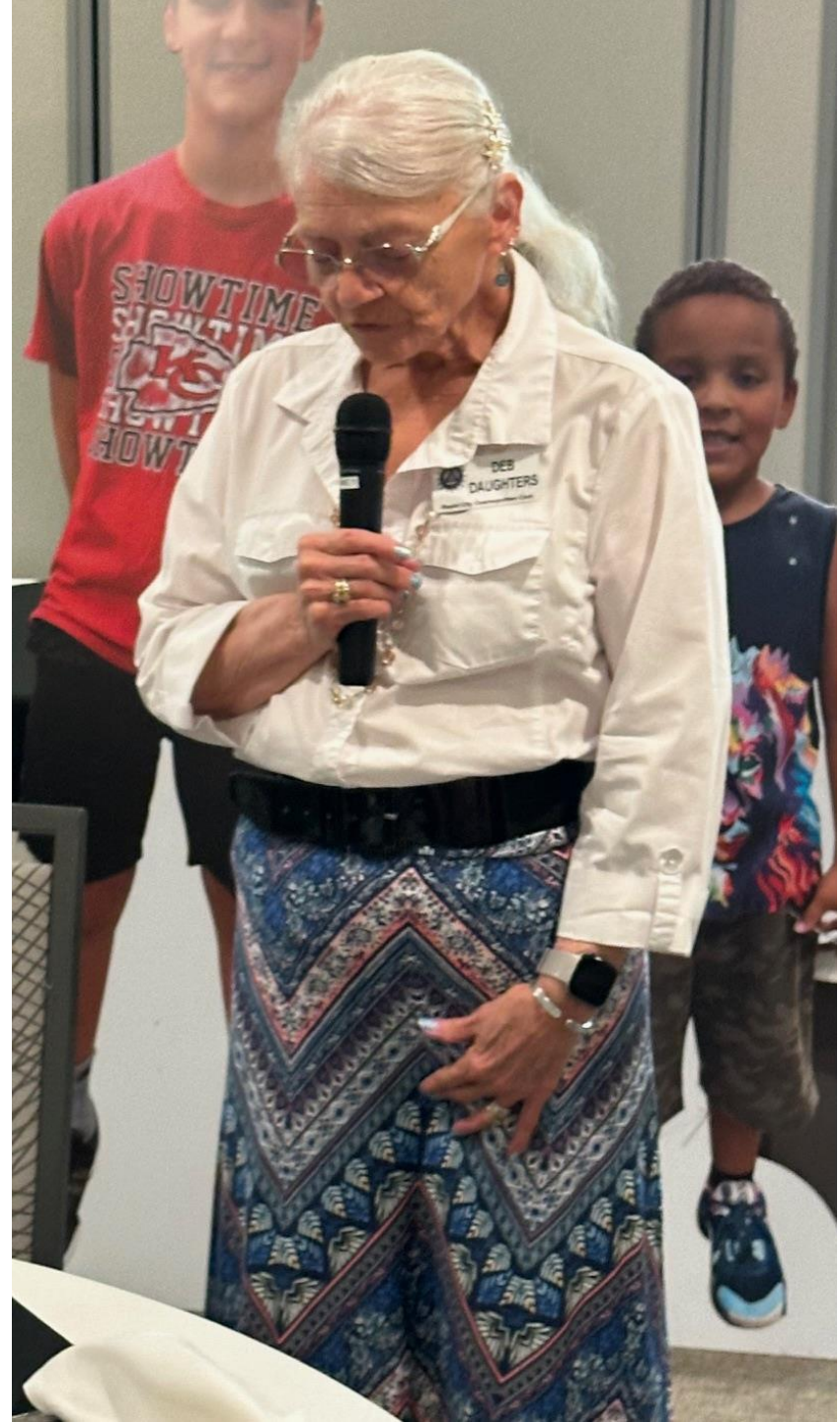

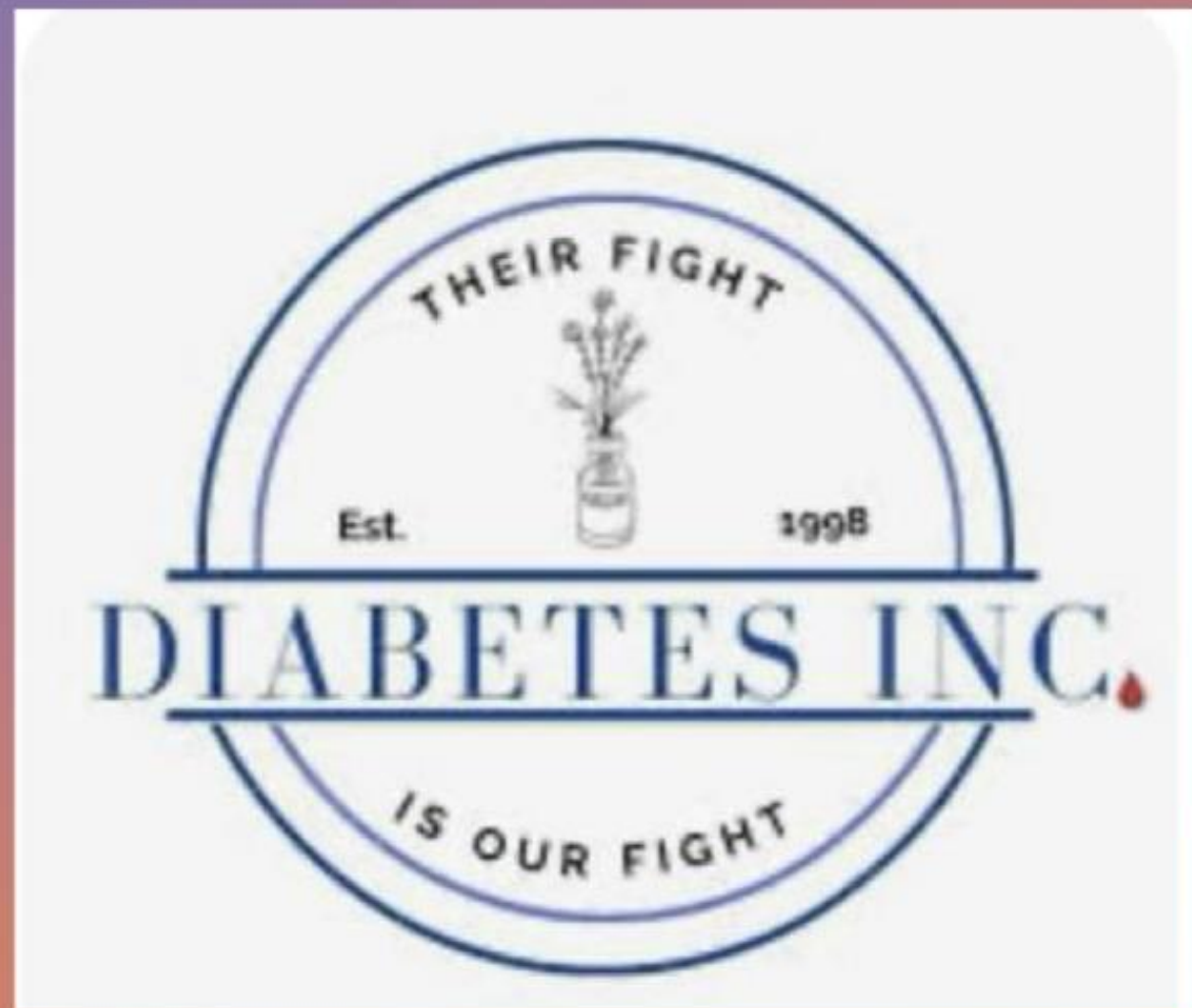

Kamp for Kids -

- Registration is open until July 19, 2024 unless we fill up before. We do not accept late registration.***
- Our camp is for kids with type 1 diabetes and their families. Kamp for Kids will be held August 9 - 11, 2024, at Outlaw Ranch in Custer, South Dakota. Camp is free for 1 child or adolescent with type 1 diabetes and 1 guardian. Extra family members are \$100 and children 3 and under are free.***
- Kamp for Kids is open to all families and kids ages 0 - 18,19. We don't look at the age, but when someone is diagnosed with type 1 diabetes. We know the diagnoses can be hard, so just reach out. We want people from all over the U.S., not just South Dakota residents.***
- Some camp activities such as rock climbing, pony rides, and horseback riding have limited space and are first come first serve. The ater people register, the more difficult it becomes to accommodate everyone, and we would really like everyone to be able to participate in all of the activities.***

- ***Our self-management program helps patients gain confidence in managing their health. Monthly classes include an individual assessment, a review of the diabetes disease process, nutritional education, physical activity consultations, medication support, disease monitoring, problem-solving, reducing risks, and suggesting healthy coping skills.***

Diabetes is a disease in which the body does not make or properly use insulin, a hormone necessary for the body to use glucose (sugar). Almost 39 million Americans have diabetes – close to 12 percent of the population. In addition, almost 4 out of 10 adults has prediabetes. The good news is that diabetes can be prevented, managed and in some cases brought into remission. Many adult patients can manage diabetes with education and lifestyle changes; however, Monument Health physicians offer a variety of treatment options, including surgery when necessary.

The major types of diabetes include:

- Type 1 diabetes:** Formerly known as juvenile-onset or insulin-dependent diabetes, this is an autoimmune disease in which the body's own immune system destroys insulin-producing islet cells in the pancreas.
- Type 2 diabetes:** Formerly known as adult-onset diabetes is a disease where insulin does not work effectively to keep the blood sugar level normal.
- Maturity-onset Diabetes of the Young (MODY):** This form of diabetes is inherited and can vary in severity. Often, MODY resembles a very mild version of type 1 diabetes with continued partial insulin production and normal insulin sensitivity.
- Gestational diabetes:** This type of diabetes develops during pregnancy in women who have not been diagnosed with diabetes before. This type of diabetes usually occurs during the second or third trimester.

Conversation: Whether you're sitting at a table for two or at a community table, food is the avenue for conversation.



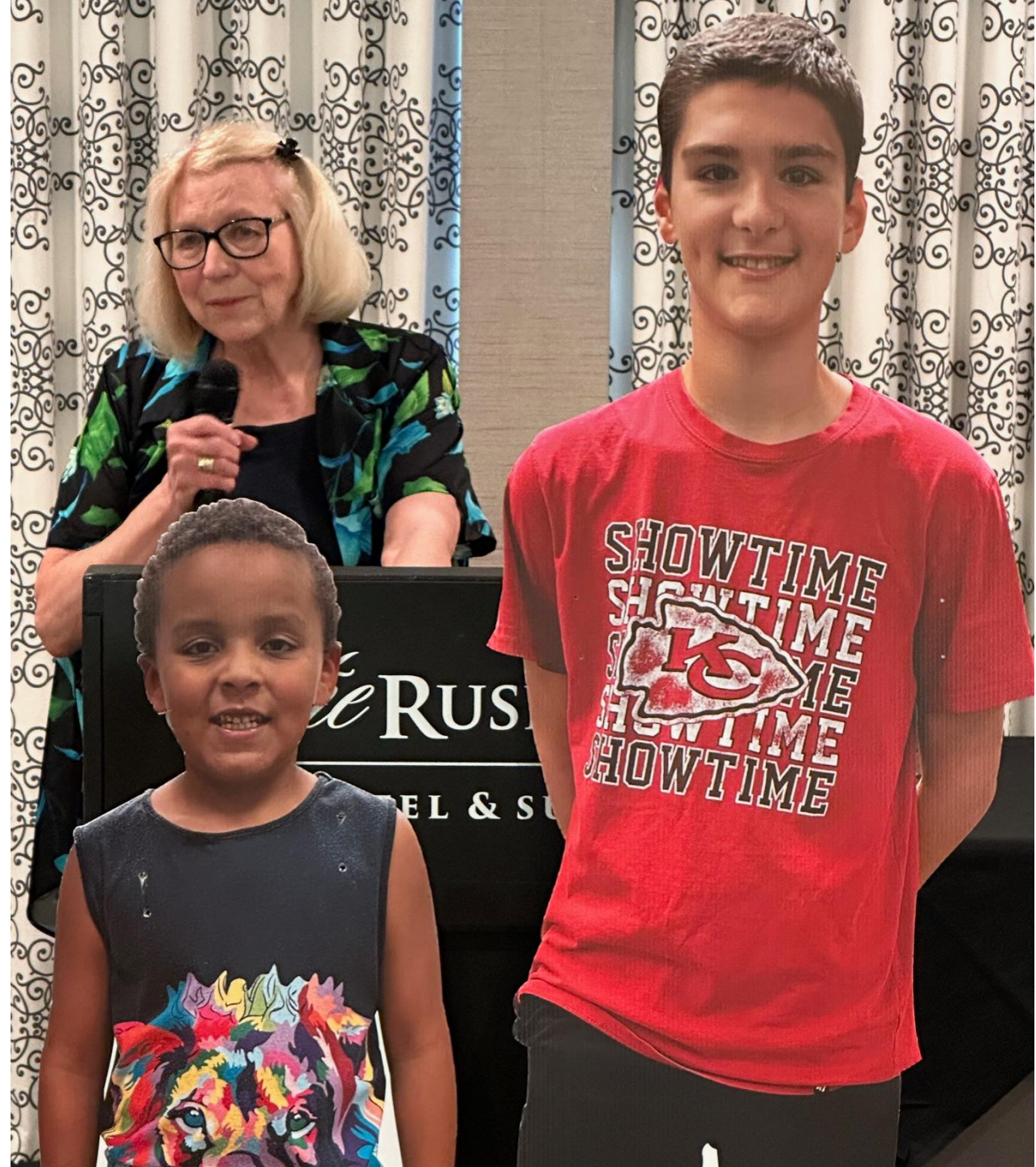


Welcome to the Café

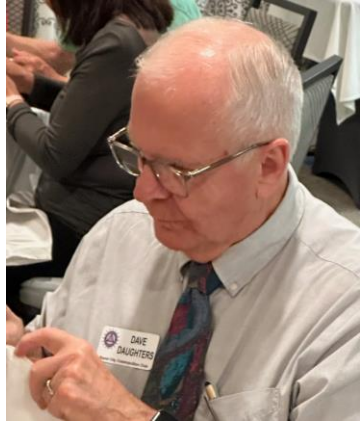
