- The 2022 Rotary International Convention will be in Houston from June 4-8, 2022. There will be a ride from each of the regions to the IFMR/Motorcyclist Motel. The southeast region ride will start on Tuesday June 1st (leaving very early to beat the heat) with a stop in Birmingham, AL for a visit to Barbers Museum and a 2nd stop in Baton Rouge, LA to have some excellent Cagin' food. information will follow on rides from the other Here is the convention URL https:// convention.rotary.org/en/houston There will be an IFMR-NA Group Picture in front of the convention center on June 3rd. Also, we will be looking for volunteers to help man the IFMR booth in the House of Friendship during the convention. The convention will be followed by a few day ride in the Texas Hill Country. More information will follow on this ride as well. If you haven't attended an RI Convention, you will be amazed by all the good we do around the world.

- August 2022. Maggie Valley or Franklin or Nantahala Village. I will either have the Gold Wing or my sports car. We'll see how my wife's foot is. The weekend of August 26th would probably have the best weather. We will take a look at lodging options and provide more information. If you have suggestions for this ride, let us know.
- October 20-23, 2022. Tom Kale is working on a Bourbon Trail Ride centered in Bardstown, KY, with rides to different distilleries and evening "sampling." In addition, I am planning to have an "add on," either before or after to visit the National Corvette Museum in Bowling Green, KY. He is also

looking at lodging with a nice porch for evening bourbon sampling.

- There was the possibility of an Chile/Argentina ride in early 2023, but right now that looks like it could be a hazardous event (https://travel.state.gov/ content/travel/en/traveladvisories/traveladvisories/ chile-travel-advisory.html). Maybe we can revisit this in later years.
- In spring or summer 2023 we are discussing the possibility of a West Virginia ride. My friend, Jim Ford, who spoke to the Rotary Club of Motorcycling Rotarians last year developed a 7 or 8 day ride around WV that we may look at. It comes complete with Lodging recommendations! Knowing Jim, this is a great ride. More to follow on this.
- In June of 2024, the RI Convention will be in Melbourne, Australia. IFMR-AUS was planning a ride in 2020 and then 2021, but they were both cancelled. I have my fingers crossed that they will reconsider it and sponsor that ride in 2024 for the convention. And if you are going all the way down under, you may as well spend a couple of weeks riding in New Zealand (that is my plan and please note that this is NOT THE TRIP OF A LIFETIME!).
- In late May of 2025 the RI convention will be in Calgary. I can guarantee that there will be a "Icefield Parkway" ride to Jasper that year, even if I have to lead it in my wheelchair! This is absolutely, positively the most spectacular ride on the planet. This is a do not miss event. You should definitely pencil this in your calendar.

My crystal ball view is getting a little hazy now, so that is about as far out as I can go.

But, it definitely looks like good IFMR-NA riding times ahead!

The ride originated at the Mobil Gas Station located on Hwy 35 in Pearland Texas.

At the Hotel Blessing the riders were treated to a family style all you can eat lunch buffet. For \$11.00 per person that's the best deal in Texas! After an enjoyable meal and relaxing fellowship, the ride made the return trek back to Houston.


