As a Rotarian in Arizona, **YOU** can **create lasting change** not only in the lives of qualified adults but the lives of those who depend on them for support.

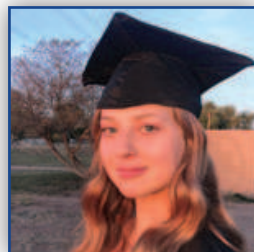
The grants issued by the Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona, Inc. pays only a portion of the educational cost. The student is responsible for the rest of the cost.

Across the globe, in our communities, and in ourselves.

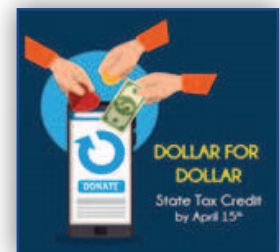
By contributing to the Rotary Vocational Fund of Arizona, Inc. you are not only making a difference in our **communities**, but in **ourselves**.

They may also be deductible as a charitable contribution for federal income tax purposes to the extent allowed by law.
