# The Five Components of the Rotary YES Program

### STUDENT COMMITMENT

After completing an application and an interview early in their junior year, local Rotary clubs select students to participate in the YES Program. Each student agrees to attend monthly leadership training, volunteer a minimum of 80 hours in their local community, help fundraise, contribute toward planning the international service projects, and travel internationally to implement the project at the end of the school year.

# MONTHLY PROGRAM MEETINGS

To qualify for the international service project during the summer, students are required to attend monthly program meetings. Throughout the school year, local Rotary members lead and mentor the students by planning events and activities together and teaching the students accountability and teamwork.

# LOCAL VOLUNTEER SERVICE

Participating students are required to volunteer a minimum of 80 hours in their local community during the school year. Half of the students' hours must be at a "main service site" outside their normal comfort zone, such as working with clients at adult daycare facilities or working with children with disabilities. By becoming relied-upon volunteers, students learn the benefits of service in their community.


## **FUNDRAISING**

3. Local programs and the international project are funded through Rotary Club sponsorships and annual fundraisers. Students help raise the funds for the international trip through contributions and fundraising activities. Each student is supported by a Rotary Club to help them achieve their fundraising goals.

# YAIL LEADERSHIP TRAINING

YES Program students participate in Rotary's Youth Adventures In Leadership Program, known as YAIL. Developed by Rotary District 5050, YAIL is a weekend leadership training retreat for district youth. Participants develop new and undiscovered leadership skills, create interpersonal bonds, embrace challenges, and learn the value of teamwork.





#### INTERNATIONAL SERVICE PROJECT

The culminating project for Rotary's YES Program is an international service project. Working under the umbrella of NGOs (non-governmental organizations), students and their leaders implement a service project in a remote area of the world. The international trip enhances relationships between cultures and participants experience making a difference through their time and labor.

International sites are selected based on the following criteria:

- The community is safe, with access to adequate housing and food.
- The international project can improve the quality of life of the people being served.
- A Rotary Club or organization in the country to help coordinate the project.
- The community is willing and able to participate in the project.

Students participating in the YES Program research the projects that will be implemented and lead the projects in the village.
