

What is it like to be a champion the NBA?

- Going to the finals means you will <u>play about 20+ extra games</u> under the highest pressure and media obligations
- You have your young stars leaving for more money
- You have a <u>late draft pick</u>, so there is no immediate "new help" or perhaps you have no draft picks at all as you traded them to get the "Win Now Mode"
- You lose hunger and get complacent
- Your stars start acting in movies while also working on their own brand
- Your older players could get hurt and in most cases this happens
- Your rivals rebuild their team and spend the summer planning specifically on how to beat "you"
- Every team gives you their best shot with big crowds to see you get <u>upset on the</u> <u>road</u>

In Reality things seem a lot different

- The greatest active coach, <u>Gregg Popovich(Spurs)</u> <u>has NEVER repeated</u>....not even close......
- Celtics never repeated
- Julius Erving and Moses Malone never repeated
- Magic Johnson only once
- Out of the 50 Greatest NBA players, 9 NEVER one championships, 16 only one, <u>and only 11 managed</u> <u>to repeat as champions - 11 only!</u>
- No NBA team has <u>EVER repeated without one of:</u> Michael Jordan, Kobe Bryant, LeBron James, Magic Johnson, Bill Russell (just passed), Isiah Thomas, Hakeem Olajuwon or George Mikan - key players help any organization.

Why Did NBA Teams Fail To Repeat?

9 teams with *injuries* to their best player

3 teams with major departures through free agency/retirement (Jordan twice)

4 teams **<u>burned out</u>** after multiple consecutive Finals appearance

5 teams lost the deciding game of a playoff series (Usually game 7)

6 Teams were **beaten by a rival** who added a Hall of Fame Player

In short - **burn out, departures, injuries and simply beaten** by a better team - If you want to create a "legacy" you/we will need to remain committed



The Solution -Does your Club District possess these traits

- Rotarians have to <u>adjust on how we lead our campaign</u>, ourselves and others - we change leadership each year. Changing leadership promotes fresh ideas while reflecting on the ideas which worked and which ones did not.
- Rotarians need to <u>learn how to play the appropriate way for</u> <u>the game</u>, <u>understanding our objective</u>, <u>good times</u>, <u>fellowship</u>, <u>charity</u>, <u>building relationships</u> while building lifelong legacies for those who will come after we are gone. This is what Rotary club is doing RIGHT NOW - are you a part of this?
- Inspiration, motivation and determination are important keys to success, life is hard, work is hard, <u>Rotarians can and</u> will always offer the inspiration you seek to End Polio.
- Understanding this is a long race with infinite tools is paramount to success.

What Motivates Rotarians to End Polio?

- The Virus is still just a plane ride away, as we have recently seen in Malawi, Mozambique and now New York City, USA
- Polio can find its' way again to any city and any country!

- We must keep up our vigilance, research, vaccinations, environmental sampling, and required funding.

As of August 3, 2022

- <u>Wild Polio</u>, (Paralyzing)
- <u>2022</u> 19 cases (1 in Afghanistan, 14 in
- Pakistan (after 0 cases in 17 months),
- 4 in Mozambique
- <u>2021</u> 6 cases (Pakistan, Afghanistan, Malawi)
- <u>2020</u> 140 (Pakistan, Afghanistan)
- <u>2019</u> 176 (Pakistan, Afghanistan)
- <u>Vaccine Derived</u> (Mutated, somewhat less severe
- and mostly in Africa)
- <u>2022</u> there are 187 cases
- <u>2021</u> there were 698 cases


Jennifer's Goals

- Your End Polio Now Coordinator or your District PolioPlus Chair Can Provide the PolioPlus Society Forms




New Polio Eradication Strategy

- <u>Goal one</u>: Permanently eradicate The Wild Polio Virus
- <u>Goal two</u>: Stop Transmission of Vaccine-Derived poliovirus


