Welcome! As a member of the River Hills/Lake Wylie Lions Club, you will become a part of the largest and most active Lions Club in the Carolinas. You are also a member of the largest service organization in the world, with 1.4 million members in 200 countries. So, wherever you go in the world you will find another Lion!

Our Background: River Hills/Lake Wylie Lions Club was established in 1975 to fulfill the “We Serve” motto of [Lions International](#). For almost 50 years, our members have met that challenge through the joy of fulfillment in our “pay it forward” efforts. Today our 142 members have fun while actively participating in the fundraising and volunteer services our Club provides. We returned over \$203,000 dollars this year to 22 charities and institutions with an emphasis on meeting the needs of our local citizens.

Our Eight Global Causes: The Eight Global Causes that are the basis of our service include vision, hunger, the environment, diabetes, childhood cancer, disaster relief, humanitarian aid and youth support. Each year we hold fundraising events to raise money for these charities, with our members volunteering to support the projects. As a Lion, you can participate in our fundraisers, such as the annual Golf Tournament, Pancake Breakfast, and Diabetes Run for Life.

We also volunteer in many other ways in our local community. With our KidSight program, Lion volunteers visit schools to screen children for vision problems. Our **educational outreach** efforts include reading to elementary school classes, providing hundreds of books through Roaring Readers free book program at Kinard, Larne and Bethany Elementary Schools, the annual Lions International Peace Poster Contest (and giving an award and recognition), and three annual scholarships to a Clover High School seniors.

A Brief History of Lions Club International:

1917: The Beginning – Chicago business leader Melvin Jones asked a simple and world-changing question – what if people put their talents to work improving their communities? As of 2020, Lions Clubs International is the world’s largest service club organization, with more than 1.3 million members in more than 48,000 clubs and countless stories of Lions acting on the same simple idea: let’s improve our communities.

1920: Going International – Just three years after our founding, Lions became international when we established the first club in Canada. Mexico followed in 1927. In the 1950s and 1960s international growth accelerated, with new clubs in Europe, Asia and Africa.

1925: Fighting Blindness – Helen Keller addressed the Lions Clubs International Convention in Cedar Point, Ohio, USA, and challenged Lions to become “knights of the blind in the crusade to eradicate darkness.” Since then, we have worked tirelessly to aid the blind and visually impaired.

1945: The ideal of an international organization is exemplified by our enduring relationship with the United Nations. We were one of the first nongovernmental organizations invited to assist in the drafting of the United Nations Charter and have supported the work of the UN ever since.

1957: Organizing Youth Programs – In the late 1950s, we created the Leo Program to provide the youth of the world with an opportunity for personal development through volunteering. There are approximately 144,000 Leos and 5,700 Leo clubs in more than 140 countries worldwide.

1968: Establishing Our Foundation – Lions Clubs International Foundation assists Lions with global and large-scale local humanitarian projects. Through our Foundation, Lions meet the needs of their local and global communities.

The Foundation Fund: The River Hills/Lake Wylie Lions Community Foundation was founded in 2004 by the River Hills/Lake Wylie Lions Club with the express purpose of supporting philanthropic individuals in our community in achieving their long-term giving goals. Its motto is **“For good. For others. For ever.”**

The Foundation seeks to build assets for the long-term benefit of the community. The Foundation fund acts as an endowment wherein all donations’ principal amounts are preserved and only the earnings are used. Donations to River Hills/Lake Wylie Lions Club Charities are made annually. Donations to the Foundation go to its investment account to provide an income stream forever. The Foundation is a separate 501(c)(3) charity within the River Hills/Lake Wylie Lions Club umbrella.

Our Meetings: We meet for a business breakfast the third Saturday of each month from 8am to 9:30am. We induct new members and receive updates on the current activities and needs of each of our fundraising committees. In addition, we meet for dinner or a social several times a year. We feature either speakers on topics of interest to Lions or we provide entertainment for holidays such as Christmas, Valentines, and the Fourth of July. We strive to provide an excellent program to keep our members informed and enlightened on the world!

Understanding your Dues: Your Initiation Fee (\$50.00) is to register you with Lions International where you get a life-time serial number as a Lion, and to buy you a new name badge.

Dues are currently \$85.00 per quarter (\$340.00/year). If you join mid quarter, your dues are prorated. If you like, you can pay the dues for the whole year at one time. Your dues include 11 business breakfasts and 3 or 4 socials.

Our club has three bank accounts. The club member's account is referred to as the Admin account. Monies collected into Admin pays members semi-annual dues to Lions International and Districts, food for the various meals, awards, and incidentals like paper, envelopes, stamps, etc.

The Charities account is funded by our special projects, such as the golf tournament and pancake breakfast. These funds are distributed annually to a variety of charities and programs. The Foundation account receives donations and invests those funds. The Foundation contributed over \$50,000 in 2024.
