ANNOUNCING 2023-2024 ROTARY YEAR COMMUNITY AWARENESS AND PREVENTION EDUCATION GRANTS

RAGAS is proud to announce its release of a request for proposals to solicit Community Awareness & Prevention Education (CAPE) grant applications. 2023 marks the second year that RAGAS has launched the CAPE grant opportunity. This Request for Proposals for prevention education projects is also posted on our website: <u>https://ragas.online/wpcontent/uploads/2023/04/RFP-CAPE-2023.pdf</u>

Applicants can be either individual Rotary Clubs or entire Rotary Districts. The deadline for grant submission is June 30th, 2023. The top 10 scoring applications will receive up to a \$1,000 RAGAS grant to assist clubs or districts in funding a community prevention education project. In addition to funding, all grantees will receive:

1. Free 1-year trial RAGAS memberships for all Rotarians in each participating Rotary Club or District.

2. Access to an updated Prevention/Education Toolbox and CAPE Global Strategy to help to create and execute a CAPE project.

3. Mentoring by a designated RAGAS coordinator, ambassador, or Board member to consult on their project and provide support on how to collaborate with partner stakeholders, including local schools, local government, NGO's and other community members.

4. All grantee clubs or Districts will be asked to adopt a pledge committing to take a public stand against human trafficking/modern slavery.<u>https://ragas.online/district-pledge/</u>.

5. All participating Clubs or Districts will be asked to appoint a human trafficking primary contact at the District or Club level who will help coordinate efforts throughout the grant period - and ideally beyond.















INTERNATIONAL PEACE CONFERNCE BIRMINGHAM ALABAMA



We are looking forward to the 2023 International Peace Conference on May 4-6 right here in the heart of the South! This conference will feature over 80 speakers from across the globe who will speak on topics such as human trafficking, reducing violence in our communities, education, social justice, empowerment of women and much more. The Human Trafficking program is particularly strong, bringing many of the best presenters I have encountered over my years of working on this issue. We will have panels on: HT and the Law, with panelists who have compiled all the national and international laws on HT; HT in the Business, with presenters from Delta, Motel 6, and Amazon; HT and Law Enforcement, with presenters from the Alabama Anti-Human Trafficking Alliance, one of the few statewide coordinating efforts in the US, as well as national law enforcement representatives; and several more.

In addition to the Human Trafficking panels and presentations, there will also be speakers on Empowering Women and Girls, some of whom are also either treating trafficking victims or educating girls on how to avoid the dangers of traffickers; on domestic violence; and, on preventing child marriage.

This is a "don't miss" event! Take advantage of the great lineup of speakers and convene with others who are dedicated to ending human trafficking as well as many more who are building peace in other ways, including the largest group of Rotary Peace Fellows you are ever likely to encounter in one place at one time.

BEYOND NET ZERO THE CANADA HUMAN TRAFFICKING DECLARATION

Rotary Action Group Against Slavery (RAGAS) and the Canadian RAGAS members (many of whom are Rotactors) with the founding group of the Canada Declaration Team (Canadian RAGAS Ambassador Barb Lustgarten Evoy, RAGAS Chair Emeritus, Dave McCleary, International Justice Mission Canada's David Pollendine, NotInMyCity's founder Paul Brandt, and The Mekong Club's founder and RAGAS board member Matt Friedman) hosted a first ever event this week in Winnipeg, Manitoba at the Canadian Museum for Human Rights. Their goal is to see Canada as the first country in the world to adopt a Zero Tolerance approach to Human Trafficking and Modern-Day Slavery. And it was a huge success! With Survivors, Canadian Senators, Members of Parliament, Local and Provincial government heads plus keynote speaker and IJM Canada's Leader Anu George Canjanathoppil, with countless organizations and groups from around the country all working together - it was nothing short of outstanding! The first follow-up to this event is already being planned for Toronto, Canada in June 2024, with a third summit being designed to run alongside the Rotary International Conference in Calgary in June 2025. A special thanks to Shell Oil President Canada, Susannah Pierce for being the presenting sponsor.

Most of all we want to thank Survivor Advocates, Jessica, Timea and April for their amazing stories courage and inspiration we should always be survivor centered in everything we do, they were truly the highlight of the summit.

The overall outcome was exciting and had the attendees are all waiting for the next summit with enthusiasm.

ROTARY GLOBAL GRANT TO PREVENT GENDER BASED VIOLENCE IN UGANDA

The Rotary Action Group Against Slavery has become aware of a global grant in Uganda through Patti Mellard of the Rotary Club of Community Action Against Human Trafficking (Rotary CAAHT).

Jennifer Montgomery, a District 5710 Peace Fellow, completed her fellowship at the Peace Center in Uganda this past year. When Jennifer was in Uganda she learned about the extreme violence and trafficking that the women of that country are subjected to. Patti been working closely with Jennifer to write a grant that is designed to prevent gender-based violence for at risk women and children in Kampala, Uganda. It is felt that this grant will make a huge difference for these women and girls and their families.

Brad Martens, an Assistant Governor and member of the Rotary Club of Columbia South in Missouri in District 6080 heard a presentation about this grant at the Zone Institute for Zones 30 & 31 and was taken by the project as he had just spent time in Uganda and was aware of the needs of these women and children. He has stepped forward to take the lead on this grant after hearing Jennifer speak. Jennifer also spoke at the Rotary International Convention in Houston.
