A fellow Rotarian who is an ultra-endurance athlete by the name of Naresh Kumar departed Astoria, Oregon on Sunday, May 19th for a six week, cross-country, solo ride on a tandem bike named Kindness. The ride is called <u>Pedaling 4 Freedom</u> and the goal is to raise awareness and funds to combat human trafficking. In his first two weeks, <u>Naresh has faced severe weather</u>, closed roads, <u>snow</u>, hail, mud, rain and flooding, and <u>breakdowns</u> yet he has persevered. His ultimate destination is Washington D.C.

RAGAS and **3Strands Global Foundation** are sponsoring this ride which is dedicated to ending human trafficking worldwide. The funds raised will be used for prevention education, one of the best ways to prevent human trafficking.

The total trek to D.C. will take approximately 6 weeks. The total fundraising goal is \$250,000. Currently, we are below \$10,000. For this reason, we need to come together and help make this happen.

A Year in Review

In June 2023, the Rotary Club of North Jacksonville applied for the 2023-24 RAGAS Community Awareness & Prevention Education (CAPE) Grant and was later awarded the funding. This grant was to fund the production of the Students Against Child Trafficking (SACT) High School Training Program at First Coast

High School.

Students Against Child Trafficking (SACT) is a 501 C.3 NPO with the mission to prevent child trafficking and exploitation by educating and empowering students internationally through researched and peer2peer, interactive, SEL, online training programs. The training is 1hour, free, and available 24/7 online in English, Spanish, and Thai. SACT currently offers the Training Program for high School and College-aged students and is in the development of a middle school and professional training program.

the Interact Students at First
Coast High School have had
various opportunities to advocate
at events like the Donna Health
and Wellness Expo, as shown to
the right where they passed out
brochures and educated
thousands of attendees on the
importance of SACT and its
mission

relevant to today's global issues surrounding trafficking and exploitation, the high school training needed to be re-filmed. This was a heavy task that the ambitious Interact students at First Coast High School took on and were able to successfully redevelop the script and film the 8 modules of life-saving material that has since been published to the SACT Training Website.







DISTRICT 6420

Since 2017, Rotary District 6420 has had a Task Force Against Human Trafficking. The Task Force was started by Toni Lucas after hearing a speaker on the topic at Rotary International. The group has since expanded and continues to focus on Education for Eradication (our motto). Our team has spoken to more than 30 other Rotary Clubs and not-for-profits this last year; explaining WHAT Human Trafficking is, how the exploitation of children occurs and WHAT can be done do to help stop these heinous crimes.

The task force has t-shirts, beanies and mugs for sale, which supports the events that raise awareness on Human Trafficking. We also started a Facebook Page with a lot of information on Human Trafficking and our Task Force.

In 2023 we sponsored the first Walk for Freedom with A21 in the Quad Cities, across our newly built 74 -Bridge. We used the previously received profits from sales of merchandise to purchase signage and pamphlets for the event. It was a great way to raise awareness and we invited Rotary District 6000 from lowa to join us for the walk. BIG things happen when small organizations work together for the same worthy cause.

Future plans include a large community event with a survivor speaking on Human Trafficking, probably this summer. In October of 2024, we have plans to Walk for Freedom with the A21 organization again. Our goal is to continue to grow the walk and have a greater impact on educating the community and surrounding areas.

As always, we will continue to speak with Rotary Clubs and other community organizations to stress educating the public on Human trafficking and how to recognize it. We would love to work together with other Rotary Clubs/Districts/Ragas on special projects or events, to educate the youth in our communities and around the World.

I have attached pictures of our Walk for Freedom, merchandise we purchased to sell, in order to buy brochures and signage AND a great article about Our Task Force Against Human Trafficking. There are some mis-quotes...like my inperson training was not with RAGAS, but with "Join the Movement" to stop Human Trafficking. (a not-for-profit training in central Illinois) But, it was a great way to spread awareness about our group and what we do.
