RINGING FOR PEACE: INTERACT QUITO RAGAS JOINS GLOBAL PEACE BELL CEREMONY

The Interact Club Quito RAGAS proudly participated in the 26th World Event and Peace Bell Ringing Ceremony, organized by the Rotary Club of Quito and the Embassy of Japan. This meaningful event brought together diplomats, Rotarians, exchange students, and public figures to promote peace and conflict resolution while also celebrating the 120th anniversary of Rotary International.

The Peace Bell is a powerful symbol of unity. Built in Japan using metals, medals, and coins from 103 countries, it carries deep historical significance. Weighing 400 kilograms, it is one of only 21 Peace Bells in the world, with four located in South America. The bell in Quito was a generous gift from the World Peace Bell Association and was inaugurated in 1999.

The original Peace Bell resides at the United Nations headquarters in New York. Its base contains fragments from Hiroshima and Nagasaki, two cities devastated by atomic bombs during World War II. The annual ringing of the bell serves as a reminder of the importance of global harmony and cooperation.

Since its installation, the Rotary Club of Quito has hosted this event each year, reinforcing its commitment to peacebuilding. The participation of Interact Quito RAGAS in this ceremony highlights the role of youth in shaping a more peaceful future. Through events like these, Rotary continues to inspire generations to work toward a world free from conflict.
